The planning decisions listed on the agenda were talked through; no comments were made.

#### 10 21/048 PLANNING APPLICATION NOT ON THE AGENDA

A/110/21/PL - BMW House Chandlers Garage Ltd, Water Lane, Angmering

The application was talked through, and various points of objection were discussed. After a long discussion the following was agreed as APCs objection to this application.

**DECISION: Objection** 

**COMMENT:** Angmering Parish Council objects to the proposed development on the grounds that it conflicts with the made Neighbourhood Plan in the following ways:

- The density, massing and design of the proposed development is out of character with its surroundings and would be an over-development of this site. The proposed buildings appear excessive in scale compared to adjacent buildings, and would be harmful to the character of the Angmering Conservation Area and the adjacent Grade II Listed Buildings of Eachways and the Lamb Inn. This is contrary to policies HA3, HD5 and HD7 of the Neighbourhood Plan and policies D SP1, D DM1, HER DM1 and HER DM3 of the Arun Local Plan. It is recommended that the amount of residential development on the site be reduced and the scheme redesigned to reflect the density and building heights of the surrounding area. Attention should be paid to the comments of the ADC Conservation Officer and the Arun District Conservation Area Advisory Panel. Neighbourhood Plan Policy EH1 applies.
- The proposed retail store, as well as contributing to the over-development of this site physically, is also likely to generate additional car parking pressure. The proposed parking provision for this store does not meet adopted parking standards for retail stores, contrary to policy T SP1 of the Arun Local Plan and does not provide additional short-term parking spaces for shoppers using the core retail area as required under policy HA3 of the Neighbourhood Plan. Given the impacts of the pandemic and the recent changes to Permitted Development Rights which allow conversion of shops to residential, it is considered more important to support existing shops than provide new ones. It is recommended that the shop unit be deleted and the economic benefit of this scheme be provided in the form of public car parking on the site.
- Further work needs to be undertaken by the applicant to demonstrate safe pedestrian access to the site from the retail area in accordance with HA3 and TM2 of the Neighbourhood Plan, especially given that WSCC does not support the widening of the pavement along Water lane as currently proposed.

Although WSCC is not in agreement with widening the footway over the whole length of the development, there should be a localised

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widening at the pinch point at the western end of Eachways. In addition, there should be dropped kerbs, tactile paving and a pedestrian refuge provided in High Street at the pedestrian entrance to the east of Eachways.

- The proposed financial contribution towards affordable housing rather than on-site provision is contrary to Policy AH SP2 of the Arun Local Plan. However, if a financial contribution is acceptable to Arun District Council then it should be ring-fenced for the Angmering Community Land Trust to support the site at Mayflower Way allocated for 12 affordable dwellings.
- The proposed provision of accommodation for older people is likely to increase the demands on the health infrastructure in Angmering, especially when considered in combination with the other two care homes proposed in the village. Contributions should be secured from the applicants to improve this healthcare provision.

#### 12 21/050 WORKING GROUPS UPDATE

Cllr. Verrinder gave the following updates to the committee:

#### **Dappers Lane Working Group**

As this group has now completed the tasks asked of them in accordance with the ToRs, and successfully had the R3 Compass Shoppers bus rerouted, APC in liaison with the Chair of Planning & Infrastructure, has decided to close the working group down — A letter of thanks has been sent to the members for the tremendous work they have done, and no doubt will continue to do so. However, APC and P&I will continue to work with WSCC on behalf of the Community to achieve a safer environment in Dappers Lane, but this will take time. This project has been and continues to be backed by our County Councillor Deborah Urquhart who is working with the County Highways Engineers and Police for a successfully safe outcome. APC will continue to support her in her efforts. In the meantime, APC will continue to advise motorists, through various media of the NO ENTRY restriction that has been placed on the junction of Dappers Lane and the Old A27 — Arundel Road.

APC will confirm on social media the bus re-routing and the change of signs at the North end of the lane.

<u>Action</u>: Prepare and publish a Facebook post re the bus re-routing and change of signs at the north end of Dappers Lane.

Cllr. Hamilton-Street has requested that the Clerk submits photos of the area relating to the development South of Water Lane, as she believes the trees have been unlawfully removed.

Cllr Verrinder brought to the table notification of an enforcement notice received by a member of the public ENF/6/20 relating to the destruction of trees on the Merry England housing development in Dappers Lane. This was discussed and noted.

#### 16 21/054 APPEALS

Cllr. Oldfield advised that originally APC did not object to A/151/20/OUT but now that this application has gone to appeal APC have been given the chance to review the application again. A discussion then took place.

It was agreed that APC would change their view from No Objection to Objection with the following comment to the Inspector by Wednesday 18 August 2021:

**COMMENT:** Angmering Parish Council initially did not object to this application, however, a further application A/46/21/OUT was received for building on a similar open area/space on this estate, and it became clear that approval of A/151/20/OUT could set a precedent for further such requests.

There are a number of similar areas of open space which are all integral to the character and appearance of this locality. They were provided, as the area developed, to contribute to the health and well-being of the residents and any significant reduction would harm that purpose.
