The Chair then reported on these additional items:

### Western Sussex Rivers Trust

On Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> September 2025, Councillor Alan Evans and I attended a workshop at ADC given by the Western Sussex Rivers Trust, Aldingbourne Parish Council (Aldingbourne Rife) and ADC. The Event was to look at the problems facing our water environment and how they impact on our communities and environment, and the actions Town and Parish Councils can take to address these problems – bearing in mind that part of the P&I remit is towards all aspects relating to water, such as supply, drainage, sewage, flooding. From the paperwork provided a report to Council will be written as to how Angmering is affected and what as a council we can do about it. A suggestion is that maybe one of the tasks of the new Groundsman would be to take on the role of “River Guardian” – training and kit will be provided. A report has been written for presentation at the next Full Council. Cllr Evans explained in more detail.

### WSSC – Extraordinary Meeting

This meeting was held earlier today to discuss:

- Devolution – Leader to make a statement on Devolution so far, and
- Local Government Re-organisation. Request for Council to support Option A – A single unitary council.

The outcome and more information will be relayed to Council at the next Full Council Meeting on 13<sup>th</sup> October 2025. Councillors are reminded that this meeting can be watched on the WSSC website. Any comments and questions are to be directed to The Clerk and The Chair of Council.

The Chair watched the meeting which she felt was very interesting to see the various viewpoints on re-organisation and the various options. The vote eventually went in favour of Option A – A Single Unitary Authority for West Sussex.

- 13      **PI25/115    SOUTH DOWNS NATIONAL PARK**  
The chair gave the following updates:
- The latest edition of the South Downs News has been published and forwarded to all councillors.
- The Authority has published its “Water in The Park” Report which highlights the state of the waterways across the South Downs region, this does of course affect Angmering where run off from the Downs flows across the A27 to the residential area by various watercourses and The Black Ditch.
- The Authority is also leading on two other projects “Downs to the Sea” and “Pounds to Ponds”. These can be read by going to the SDNP website. This links in with the Western Sussex River Trust meeting that Cllr. Evans and the Chair attended.
- The next SDNP Town & Parish Council meeting will be held online on Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> October 2025 at 18:30h. The Chair and Cllr. Bennett will be attending. A report, when available will be given at a Full Council meeting of the meeting will follow in due course.
- The SDNPA has advised that there is a short time left to let them know of any sites that could be considered to meet Gypsy, Traveller and Travelling Show people accommodation needs. This call for sites is due to end on 5<sup>th</sup> October 2025.
- 14      **PI25/116    COMPLIANCE/ENFORCEMENT**  
**ENF/6/20**  
**Land at Merry England Nursery/Swallows Gate, Dappers Lane.**  
It appears that the entrance into the development and footpath along the eastern side of Dappers Lane from the site, part towards Merryfield Crescent is now constructed, ADC has yet to confirm they are satisfied with this construction work. However, the Chair said that having walked to the site from Merryfield Crescent, the footpath on the western side of Dappers Lane to Merryfield Crescent from the crossover point is still to be constructed, therefore Condition 10 has **not** been fully complied with (nor are there signs that they intend to do so) so cannot be discharged. More information on the progress of this is awaited. It is possible that the upcoming appeal will relate to this part of Condition 10. The developer still has until April 2026 (7 months) to comply with the Enforcement Notice.
- APC are still awaiting a reply from ADC that the work done so far is acceptable. The Clerk will continue to speak to compliance to find out if they are happy with the work done and whether the developer will start/complete the condition by April 2026 and not go to an Appeal.

**15      PI25/117    APPEALS**

**Swallow Gate Vehicle Access, Dappers Lane. - PINS ref: APP/C3810/C/25/3364403**

APC have been advised that from the 29<sup>th</sup> May 2025, the issue of an Enforcement Notice (ENF/6/20) is being appealed. We currently await further information on this appeal regarding the non-compliance with Condition 10 of A/142/16/OUT as varied by A/91/18/PL and detailed by A/111/23/DOC of 27<sup>th</sup> June 2023. The closure date for comments was 31<sup>st</sup> July 2025.

We also currently await the date and location for the hearing. (see item 17)

**Land West of Bewley Road. - PINS. ref: APP/C3810/W/25/3369419**

Gleeson Land have now appealed against the refusal by ADC for the development of 190 residential dwellings and a community building together with the provision of open space, landscaping and associated infrastructure. Application A/154/24/OUT refers.

The date of the Inquiry is 28<sup>th</sup> October 2025 from 10:00, to be held in the Civic Centre, Littlehampton for a maximum of 8 days. (Timings: on Tues 28<sup>th</sup> – Fri 31<sup>st</sup> October and Tues 4<sup>th</sup> - Fri 7<sup>th</sup> November).

The “Angmering Community Alliance” continues to meet and communicate with residents, the Legal Team and experts to discuss the strategy to put to the Planning Inspector for dismissal. On Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> the Legal Team made a site visit which was followed by a meeting to discuss the findings and process, this meeting was attended by 2 members of the Alliance.

**Other Highways Matters affecting Angmering**

**Update on Water Lane Sewer work**

The first tranche of work within the village centre is now complete so the village centre and the High Street are now open. The works are moving towards Cumberland Crescent which means that Water Lane into the Village Square will remain closed with access only.

The Clerk and her Staff continue to monitor the situation and discuss with Southern Water / Clancy any problems that may arise.

**Update on Traffic Lights replacement on the A259**

Work is continuing and causing holdups on the A259 between the Blue Star Roundabout and Windmill Roundabout at the location of the Traffic Signals outside the retail park and South Drive. These are being refurbished between

Monday 8 September and Wednesday 24 October 2025. Road Closures notices and Directions will continue to be in place.

There are complaints about the blocking of the Blue Star Roundabout, what can be done about it? Suggestions have been made that some form of traffic control is installed such as temporary traffic lights to ease the flow of through traffic and prevent blockage:

Despite attempts to have the hatching replaced, WSCC are still not making any headway. The Clerk will continue to pursue the matter and to find out why the holdup and to enquire about temporary traffic lights.  
This was discussed at length.

The Department of Transport Traffic Signs Manual Chapter 3 (Section 8.7.1) specifies within a ‘zone’, speed limit repeater signage isn’t required, so long as there is a sufficient traffic calming feature at regular 100m intervals. There are many types of traffic calming features that can be used within a zone, including speed humps, road marking roundels, pedestrian refuge, junctions or bends in the road. Within nearby roads such as Nursery Road/Bramley Way, the priority/give way systems are essentially traffic calming features in themselves and unless there is evident need or fundamental change for additional signage at this location, extra 20mph repeater signage would not currently be a high priority at this time. A280 - now the roundabout is being constructed - a sign may possible be added to say "Angmering Village Only" and "Not suitable for HGV's".
